First Reading (Jeremiah 23:1-6) The 'weeping prophet' is charged with addressing the scandal of bad shepherds and scandalous shepherding. Jeremiah simultaneously gives us clear insight into Yahweh's concern for his flock. It's both a warning to leadership and a consoling and reassuring message to the people. Splendid in his ability to speak on behalf of Yahweh, Jeremiah is signalling how, in the interest of ensuring that not one will be lost, some will now have to be moved aside as confidence is restored.

Second Reading (Ephesians 2:13-18) Christ has opened for all the possibility and the means of salvation. Nobody is far away now, differences and difficulties created by the law have been abolished; triumph on and through the cross have meant the end of hostility and barrier; peace now reigns and the one Spirit is an open, accessible path for all peoples to the Father.

Gospel Reading (Mark 6:30-34) The need for rest and reflection is the starting point in today's Gospel. The apostles have ministered well; it's time for a little time away. But it is short lived. The people are hungry for the message, the chief pastor knows the needs of his sheep - and he doesn't leave it till later - he does it now and 'at some length'. The Master is setting the standard for pastors.

GIFT AID TO YOUR PARISH

Gift Aid contributions are a very important part of our parish income.

If you wish to Gift Aid please contact a member of the Finance Committee:- John Roblin, Doreen Utley or Phil Dooley. They will gladly help you to complete the mandate which will enable you to start your Gift Aid contribution. Alternatively you can speak to one of the priests.

Who can Gift Aid?

Two conditions are required:


- (1) **You must be (UK) tax payer.**
 - (2) **The Gift Aid Offering must be recorded in one of two ways.**
 - (i) **banker's order**, the majority of people contribute in this way
 - (ii) **numbered envelope.**
- (2) This means that the parish can claim back an additional 25% of your contributions, at no additional cost to yourself.

Sunday Mass for the Housebound

A few people have suggested that there should be a way of **streaming Masses to the housebound of the parish.** At the moment there are discussions taking place to set up this facility. However it will require a computer or ipad to receive the transmission. The setting up of the facility will cost around £3000 plus vat with £1200 as a yearly cost. Any help to get this started and to maintain this venture will be much appreciated. Thank you.
