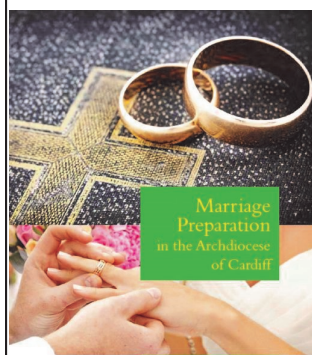

First Reading (1 Kings 19:4-8)

This story of Elijah begging for death will be painfully familiar to anyone who has suffered debilitating depression. At a point of crisis, Elijah insists that it is too much for him and he cannot continue. The angel of the Lord comes to him, not urging him to be steadfast, but with food and water. The simplicity of this gesture is enough to spur Elijah on.

Second Reading (Ephesians 4:30-5:2)

In this letter, St Paul reminds the Ephesians that simply having God's spirit within us won't magically make us live in accordance with it. To live honestly, authentically and justly and to show love and compassion requires practice. The Spirit of God inspires us, gives an example to us and strengthens us, but the desire and effort must be our own and must be ongoing.

Gospel Reading (John 6:41-51)

The Jews are often presented in the gospel as the antagonists. In reality, many of their concerns about Jesus sprang from their deep belief in the one true God. They were perturbed when Jesus described himself as having 'come down from heaven'. To them, such a statement was akin to blasphemy. He was claiming to be from God. Therefore, he was a threat to their faith. It was this quick judgement, this unwillingness to listen that ultimately led to the crucifixion of Christ. There are people who strive to love and understand others, and there are people who allow themselves to be consumed by fear, anger and a destructive 'us-and-them' mentality.

GIFT AID TO YOUR PARISH

Gift Aid contributions are a very important part of our parish income.

If you wish to Gift Aid please contact a member of the Finance Committee:- John Roblin, Doreen Utley or Phil Dooley. They will gladly help you to complete the mandate which will enable you to start your Gift Aid contribution. Alternatively you can speak to one of the priests. **Who can Gift Aid?**

Two conditions are required:

- (1) **You must be (UK) tax payer.**
- (2) **The Gift Aid Offering must be recorded in one of two ways.**
 - (i) **banker's order**, the majority of people contribute in this way
 - (ii) **numbered envelope.**
- (2) This means that the parish can claim back an additional 25% of your contributions, at no additional cost to yourself.

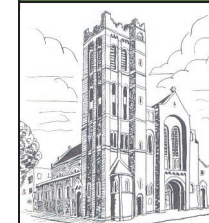
