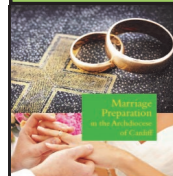

Spirituality & Dementia Project

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales (Mental Health Fund) have awarded funding to the Cardiff Archdiocese's project to raise awareness of Dementia and the spiritual needs of those living with it. This two year project aims to make the Archdiocese a Dementia Friendly Community for the benefit of all our parishes, parishioners and communities. Sr Susan Armond (Sisters of St Joseph of Annecy) and Joanne White (Archdiocesan Family Life Worker) are working on this project with the support of His Grace Archbishop Stack. Both Sr Susan and Joanne are trained as Dementia Friends Champions and are offering free **one-hour information sessions** wherever requested. These sessions are suitable for anyone interested in finding out more about dementia and are open to anyone living within our Archdiocese (whether Catholic or not).

GIFT AID TO YOUR PARISH

Gift Aid contributions are a very important part of our parish income. If you wish to Gift Aid please contact John Roblin, Doreen Utley or Phil Dooley. They will gladly help you to complete the mandate which will enable you to start your Gift Aid contribution. Or you can speak to one of the priests.

Who can Gift Aid? There 2 conditions:

- (1) **You must be (UK) tax payer.**
- (2) **The Gift Aid Offering must be recorded in one of two ways.**
 - (i) **banker's order**, the majority of people contribute in this way
 - (ii) **numbered envelope**

This means that the parish can claim back an additional 25% of your contributions, at no additional cost to yourself.

First Reading (*Isaiah 53:10-11*)

This section of the Prophet Isaiah returns to the theme of the suffering servant. The Messiah who will come will not be a worldly king, but a servant of all - a servant who will give his life for others. He will become the scape-goat, though innocent, taking on our sins and our failings. He will win life for us.

Second Reading (*Hebrews 4:14-16*)

Once again, the Letter to the Hebrews assures us that though Christ is the one true High Priest, he is the one who understands us. Christ has been tempted in every way. Christ understands the challenges and difficulties of our lives. And because Christ understands us, he is ever merciful.

Gospel Reading (*Mark 10:35-45*)

Those closest to Jesus must continue at the school of discipleship. Though Christ has constantly reminded them that he is not a messiah who will bring worldly power, they fail to understand. They ask for glory and reward. But following Christ is about service. The follower of Christ is 'not to be served, but to serve'.

St. Mary's Parish Christmas Bazaar

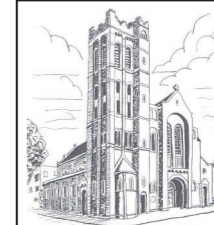
Only 6 weeks until the Parish Bazaar on
