First Reading (Jeremiah 33:14-16) In the midst of prophecies concerning exile and displacement, Jeremiah offers the hope of ultimate restoration and a fresh start for God's chosen people. Just as the downfall had been due to corrupt and misguided governance, so their hopes for renewal will centre upon an altogether new kind of leadership, in which the lineage of King David will be restored. Honesty, integrity and faithfulness to God's covenant will be the hallmarks of this renewal, rather than any conventional form of political revival.

Second Reading (Thessalonians 3:12-4:2) Writing to the largely gentile converts who made up the Christian community in Thessalonica, Paul encourages their perseverance. Timothy has returned from visiting the Thessalonians with very positive accounts, for Paul, of their fidelity. This has lifted Paul's heart. He looks forward to seeing them again and, meanwhile, exhorts them to continue their efforts in the Christian life and its demands. This letter is traditionally viewed as being Paul's earliest and, therefore, the oldest writing in the New Testament.

Gospel Reading (Luke 21:25-28, 34-36) This eschatological discourse, or sermon on the things to come, effectively draws the public ministry of Jesus to a close in each of the Synoptics. Remarks, by onlookers, on the grandeur of the Temple provoke a reaction from Jesus, prophesying its destruction. Jesus foretells the terrors which will be visited upon Jerusalem and the world around it, in advance of the final coming of the 'Son of Man'. The disciples are warned to be vigilant and prayerful in the face of all that is going to happen.

It has been decided after much discussion with the 10am Ministers of the Eucharist to alter the distribution of Holy Communion at 10am Sunday Mass beginning December 16th.

The changes are as follows:-


- 1. Communicants are asked to come up row by row beginning from the front and working back. Those in the side aisles are asked to follow on from the back middle rows.
- 2. There will be **four** (not two) Ministers distributing the sacred hosts (Those coming up in procession should fan out to receive communion from one of the Ministers)
- 3. There will be only be two Chalices (one each side) giving the precious Blood.

12 noon

The only change to 12 noon Mass is that instead of four Chalices there will be only two Chalices, one on each side.




The Journey of Faith meet every Thursday at 7.30pm in the Priory, 67 Talbot St.
