First Reading *(Daniel 12:1-13)*

The book of Daniel belongs to the genre of apocalyptic, a kind of literature that arose during a time when devout people felt alienated from the world and its powers. They found encouragement in the conviction that no matter what conflicts arose, God was in command and his victory was assured.


Second Reading *(Hebrews 10:11-14)*

Christ, who was sacrificed, also offered a sacrifice. Christ the victim Christ the priest. By having been victim and priest, the Lord now sits in victory and in judgement over his enemies. Whatever struggles God's people may face in this life, we take confidence in the Lord's victory over every suffering and evil. This is a victory in which we hope to share.

Gospel Reading *(Mark 13:24-32)*

Like the Book of Daniel, this passage from Mark's Gospel belongs to the genre of apocalyptic. It can remind us of two realities: God's people will not be spared the sufferings that come upon the world; God's people are assured of the final victory of God and his goodness. The Lord makes it clear, however, that the timing of all these things lies in God's providence, and that we should not trouble ourselves with times and dates.

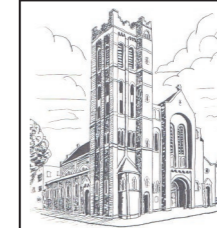
