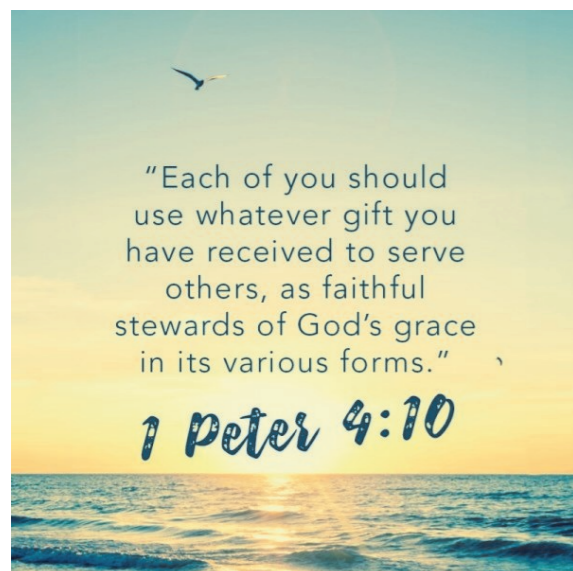


Faith in Action: Night Shelter Programme at St Mary's

First Reading (Isaiah 62:1-5)

Isaiah compares the joy of the bridegroom for his bride to God's joy in a purified Israel and as 'a young man marries a virgin', so it is between God and his people. In this passage, eros is not a base feeling, but the love by which God calls Israel 'my delight' who is now 'espoused' to God. The love between a husband and wife is now the love by which one can sense how much one is loved by God.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

The miracle at Cana was for a few select disciples but after Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gives to all the baptised a grace of charism for the common good. St Paul lists these supernatural graces which find expression in the different ministries of the Church and together, just as the individual body parts make the whole body; so these graces unite the Church as the Bride of Christ.

Gospel Reading (John 2:1-11)

'The mother of Jesus was there' and already she represents the interceding Church, who asks her Son to help the newly married couple from the embarrassment of running out of wine. Jesus does not want to intervene and in her last words in the Gospels, Mary, in the tradition of the matriarchs of the Old Testament, instructs the servants 'Do whatever he tells you' and the water becomes wine. At Cana Jesus performs his first miracle and Mary her first intercession on behalf of the People of God.

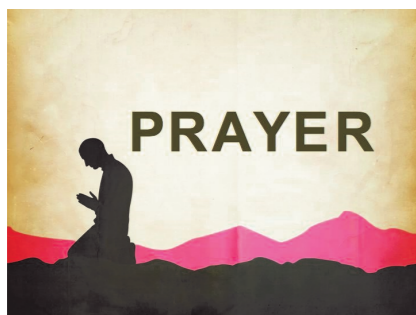

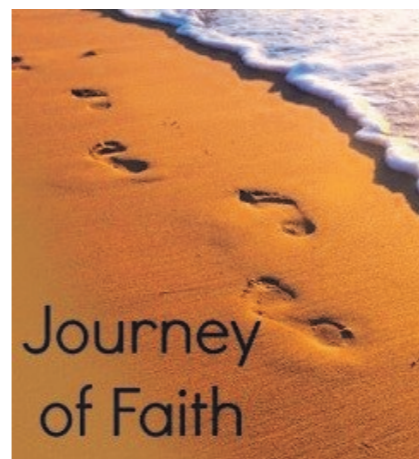

Journey of Faith

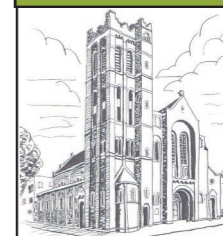

Ministers of the Word please note that each reading ends with the words "The word of the Lord"

not "This is the word of the Lord" It emphasises that the word of the Lord is what is proclaimed by the reader and takes root in the hearts of the people, not what is printed in a book. Saying "This is the word of the Lord" can give the wrong impression.

Many other English-speaking countries have already been saying "The word of the Lord" and "the Gospel of the Lord" for many years. We are simply coming into line with them. Also it would be good if the reader pauses at the end of the reading before proclaiming the words "The word of the Lord"
