### READINGS FOR 14TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Isaiah 66:10-14.

"Rejoice, Jerusalem, be glad for her, all you who love her."

"At her breast will her nurslings be carried and fondled in her lap."

The Book of Isaiah is comprised of texts from three distinct authors, with today's extract being taken from the third. It is written after the return of Israel from exile in Babylon. We might be tempted to think that the return home would bring nothing but joy but in fact there was widespread depression. The returning exiles were facing immense obstacles. The return had been staggered over a number of generations and Israel remained a subjugated nation. It was proving impossible to successfully re-establish themselves as a self-sufficient and confident community. Nonetheless, the prophet, this third Isaiah, calls on Israel to 'Rejoice'. The prophet depicts Jerusalem as a mother who is lavish with her maternal affection and consolation. God himself comforts and nourishes his people just as a mother would comfort and nourish her child. The imagery provided by the prophet promises a future where peace will flow like a river and joy will abound. Hope is provided when we are subject to the temptations of depression.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 65.

Cry out with joy to God all the earth.

Galatians 6:14-18.

"The only thing I can boast about is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world."

Paul expressed himself rather excitedly and vehemently in his Letter to the Galatians. Paul's anger was directed at those Christians who had clung too closely to the practices of Judaism and who were insisting that new converts adopt the same attitude. Paul calls them 'senseless'. Paul takes us back to the kernel of his message. There is no room for pride in ethnic birth nor in any human achievement. The central factor of significance is the cross of Jesus Christ. Circumcision has no significance in the face of the crucifixion of Christ. In the cross we are a new creation, the cross that is the great 'Sign of Contradiction'.

Alleluia, Alleluia!

I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father.

Alleluia!

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit."

"Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves.

Proclaim – "The kingdom of God is very near to you."

Christ instructs the seventy-two to preach the Good News, to bring the peace of God into the midst of every community they visit. The Kingdom of God is the Kingdom of Peace. There is no abiding peace outside the Kingdom and so the Kingdom is to be embedded in the soil of the entire world, in the hearts of everyone. Peace is found in submitting to the sovereignty of God, to the sovereignty of his love. The instructions historically delivered to the seventy-two are instructions meant for all disciples. Wherever we go, whoever we meet, we must carry the same message, the same hope – God's abiding peace.

## THE RELICS OF ST JOHN LLOYD AND ST PHILIP EVANS (THE CARDIFF MARTYRS) VISITING THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CARDIFF

The Relics were recently discovered and verified at the Jesuit-run Stonyhurst College in Lancashire. St John Lloyd was born in Brecon and studied for the priesthood at the Royal English College, Valladolid, Spain, becoming a Mission (Diocesan) Priest. St Philip Evans was born in Monmouthshire and studied for the priesthood in France with the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Lloyd was arrested at Penllyn (Glamorganshire) on November 20<sup>th</sup> 1678 and Evans was arrested at Sker (Glamorganshire) on December 4<sup>th</sup> 1678. They were brought together in a cell at Cardiff Castle, located to the left of the Main Gate. They were taken to Gallows Field (now the north end of Richmond Road in Roath) for execution on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1679. Fr Evans was 34 years and Fr Lloyd was 49 years. The two were among the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales who were Canonised by St Paul VI in 1970.
