Readings continued Luke 10:1-12, 17-20.
The man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?"

Jesus answers with the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Luke takes all the venom out of Mark's story of the controversy of a lawyer questioning Jesus over the Law and makes it a dialogue about how to gain eternal life. The parable is a familiar expression of generosity in which a despised Samaritan is depicted as the hero, the one who does what is needed, does what is right. The Jews who pass by the man in need had good 'religious' excuses for doing so as they were bound to avoid all contact with a possible corpse lying in a ditch which would bring them defilement. Religion must never become a convenient shield against unpleasant duties.

READINGS FOR 15TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Deuteronomy 30:10-14.

Moses said to the people: "Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keeping those commandments and laws of his that are written in the Book of the Law, and you shall return to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul."

"For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach."

"The Word is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance."

The Book of Deuteronomy, though written in the seventh century B.C., poses as being three discourses on the Law delivered by Moses personally (even though Moses lived seven hundred years earlier). Today's passage is the conclusion of the third 'discourse'. The emphasis stresses the importance of the whole Law, the Law as an integrated whole. The text highlights the importance of obeying the Law by making it clear that allegiance is a rather 'matter-of-fact' undertaking, the most natural thing within the human condition. The Law is not some strange esoteric discipline, not something too hard nor beyond our strength.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 68.

Seek the Lord, you who are poor, and your hearts will revive.

Colossians 1:15-20.

"Christ Jesus is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation ... all things were created through him and for him."

"God wanted ... all things to be reconciled through him and for him." Paul here employs and augments an already extant early Christian hymn to proclaim the importance of Christ. Because we are fully accustomed to acknowledging the divinity of Christ, we should recognise how important and impactful these words of Paul were to the early Christian community. Paul, steeped in the Hebrew Scriptures and wider Hebrew tradition and literature, is endeavouring to express the utter uniqueness of this particular human being (Jesus Christ), without contradicting the foundation statement that there is only one God, totally transcendent. The primacy of Christ is expressed with regard to the three moments of PAST, PRESENT and FUTURE. For the past Paul refers to creation as it is viewed in Hebrew wisdom literature. Christ is that image in which God created everything, a reflection of himself called in the Bible the 'Wisdom of God' – this served as a model in God's exercise of his creative power. Christ is not only a sort of template for all creation, but it was for him and towards him that everything was created. Christ occupies the place that had hitherto always been reserved for God. With regard to the present Paul expressed Christ's primacy on two levels. All creation is held together in him, or better is articulated on him and receives its consistency only in him. On another level, the Church is the realisation of Christ in the world which he nourishes and guides in every detail, as a head directs the body. For the future he is the firstborn of a new creation out of death, through whom there can no longer be a rift from God, for his is the pledge of the peace of creation with God.

Alleluia, Alleluia!

(Apostleship of the Sea)**

THE RELICS OF ST JOHN LLOYD AND ST PHILIP EVANS (THE CARDIFF MARTYRS) VISITING THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CARDIFF

The Relics were recently discovered and verified at the Jesuit-run Stonyhurst College in Lancashire. St John Lloyd was born in Brecon and studied for the priesthood at the Royal English College, Valladolid, Spain, becoming a Mission (Diocesan) Priest. St Philip Evans was born in Monmouthshire and studied for the priesthood in France with the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Lloyd was arrested at Penllyn (Glamorganshire) on November 20th 1678 and Evans was arrested at Sker (Glamorganshire) on December 4th 1678. They were brought together in a cell at Cardiff Castle, located to the left of the Main Gate. They were taken to Gallows Field (now the north end of Richmond Road in Roath) for execution on 22nd July 1679. Fr Evans was 34 years and Fr Lloyd was 49 years. The two were among the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales who were Canonised by St Paul VI in 1970.
